## Bunya Room News

A message from Regan,

Term 3 saw the Bunya Room children very excited to share information about their family pets. This emerging interest sparked curiosity and imagination in our dramatic play area, with children caring for our Bunya Room toy puppy. we learnt about pet needs, food, shelter, water etc. We also focused on showing care, empathy and kindness to living creatures. Early numeracy skills were developed through play-based activities such as making and counting play dough bones for our puppy, we also created a Bunya Room graph to record our family pets (dogs were the most popular pet.) Our fine and gross motor movements were developed through lots of music, dance, finger rhymes and using various materials to create artwork.

The interest extended into discussions about native animals. The children were keen to spot and learn more about animals, specifically native animals on Gubbi Gubbi Country at Kindy.



We learnt the Gubbi Gubbi names for these animals, used play to investigate and explore nature whilst respecting Country and connecting with animals and their natural environment. The children followed and extended their own interests with enthusiasm, enjoying Aboriginal animals stories and learning about a local Gubbi Gubbi artist. They created and recreated their own native animal stories, using language to express their ideas and imagination. We also focused on how symbols and pattern systems work, learning about Aboriginal animals tracks and symbols.

A message from Rachael,

How is another term over already! This last term has been a wonderful time of growth for our little Bunya's. We have celebrated friends turning 4 and celebrated all of the new skills the children are gaining.

The children now lead the morning song and Acknowledgement to Country without assistance and we always give ourselves a pat on the back or a silent cheer to show how proud we are of ourselves.

How to be a good friend has been explored further with the use of social stories and the colour monsters. Re-creating problems or challenges that have arisen during the day using visual stories and puppets has helped children learn the skills needed to negotiate and talk through any issues. I can often hear children copying the verbal language we have practised during their own play situations, 'I can see you are sad can I help?





Music and rhythm have been group favourites. We have learnt new songs using key word signs, body drumming, lovely lycra and tapping sticks. the children are practising sequence and memory through rhythm games and are getting very good at it very quickly.

For the nature calendar this term the highlight has been the class caterpillar who still hasn't got a name that we can agree on, however we do agree that we have enjoyed watching him eat and grow and have had many discussions about when and what he will turn into.

Every day I am greeted with beautiful excited little faces that are keen to share their joy. I can't quite believe that we only have I more term together.

### Wattle Room News



BUSH KINDY

The Wattle Class have been focused on science, and occupations this term as well as getting ourselves ready for our transition to Prep!

In science we have explored fossils, magnets, gemstones and the human body.

Our dramatic play zones have included; "The Office", "Doctors Surgery", "Construction Zone" and big school role play "Prep Class."

We often talk about what Prep will be like, looking at photos of the local schools and uniforms. We discuss things we still need or want to learn as well as skills we need to keep practising, like filling our own drink bottles, opening snack packets, writing our names, building resilience and packing our bags independently.

In the classroom we have also been really interested in group games, incorporating numeracy, movement, teamwork and chance. As well as playing all the classic group games, we have also enjoyed creating our own original games such as, "Dice of Doom", "Musical Bottoms", "Where is Gabby Ghost?", "Beanbag Dance and Throw", and the hilarious "Sausages" game.



EXPLORING GEMSTONES

At Bush Kindy each week we have regularly shared the environment with the local kangaroos and birds. After our children lead 'Acknowledgement to Country' children would then choose where and what they wanted to play. Each week we would take our trolley with various resources including mud kitchen utensils, a ladder for climbing trees, and art materials. Children oftern chose to collect flowers, build structures with sticks and collect rubbish to clean up the environment and play in the mud! Oh so much fun!

Our final term of Kindy I'm sure will really fly by! We will be commencing a 4 week swimming program on Fridays starting week 4, celebrating Under 8's day with the school(10t October), continuing Prep transition visits and hosting a Kindy Graduation/Christmas party towards the end of term, where children will be doing a special performance.

## What are Transition Statements?



As your child's time in Kindergarten comes to an end, we begin preparing important information that supports their smooth and successful transition into Prep. One of the key tools we use is the **QCAA Transition**Statement.

#### What is a QCAA Transition Statement?

A Transition Statement is a short document developed by the **Queensland Curriculum and Assessment Authority (QCAA)**. It provides a snapshot of your child's learning and development across the Kindergarten year, focusing on the five key learning and development areas:

**Identity** – your child's sense of self and confidence. **Connectedness** – relationships, respect, and belonging.

**Wellbeing** – physical, social, and emotional growth. **Active learning** – curiosity, persistence, and problemsolving.

**Communicating** – language, literacy, and expression.

#### Why are Transition Statements important?

These statements:

- ✓ Help Prep teachers get to know your child as a
- ✓ Highlight your child's strengths, interests, and progress.
- Support continuity between Kindergarten and school.
- ✓ Encourage positive partnerships between families, Kindergarten educators, and schools.

#### How are they created?

Your child's Kindergarten teachers carefully compile the statement based on their ongoing observations and assessments throughout the year. Families are also invited to contribute, ensuring the statement reflects your child's unique personality and learning journey.

#### What happens next?

With your consent, the Transition Statement is shared directly with your child's new school. This means your child's Prep teacher will already have valuable insights into how best to support their learning and wellbeing right from the very first day.

At Peregian Beach College Early Learning Centre, we see Transition Statements as a bridge between the familiar and the new — helping every child step into Prep with confidence, readiness, and excitement.
